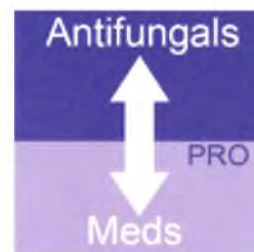

This free APP will tell you if there is a known interaction of clinical significance between a prescription drug and the following panel of antifungal medicines: *itraconazole, voriconazole, posaconazole, fluconazole, amphotericin B, ambisome, micafungin, caspofungin, terbinafine, isavuconazole and anidulafungin.*

- There are currently 2161 recorded interactions.
- Type in your prescription drug to the search box and if there is an interaction it will tell you the severity using a simple green/yellow/red traffic light system, provide some information and suggest further action where appropriate.
- If a drug is not in the listing then there are currently no recorded interactions with these antifungal medicines. In the event new interactions are reported we will update.
- Available as a free smartphone APP called “**Antifungal Interactions**” for both Android and iOS.
- Also available as an online database at www.antifungalinteractions.org
- The database is regularly updated by a pharmacist referring to UK Medicines Compendium (www.medicines.org.uk) and in conjunction with Stockleys drug interactions.
- The database is available in 2 versions, one intended for use by patients and one for medical professionals (PRO).
